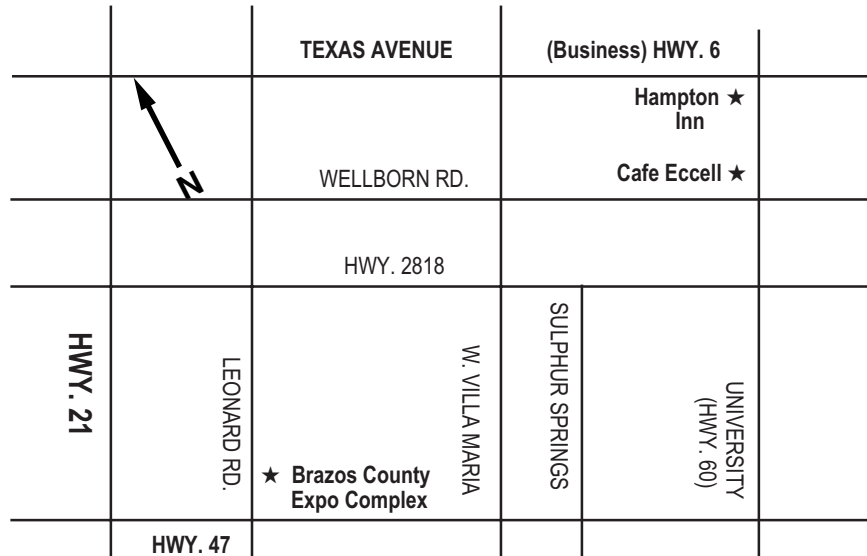

The Southwest and Lone Star Peruvian Horse Clubs believe in listening to our members and also to making positive efforts to move the Peruvian horse breed forward with the National American Peruvian Horse Association (NAPHA). We welcome all Peruvian horse owners to participate in our activities, but only advertising and registration papers from NAPHA-recognized registries will be accepted, as per the wishes of our membership who voted for one registry: NAPHA.

NAPHA (which is an amalgam of AAOBPPH and PPHRNA) is the only registry for Peruvian horses recognized by Peru, Canada and other foreign registries. It would be dishonest to accept advertising or registration papers from any other registry that, in truth, does not exist.

An unsuspecting buyer who purchases a horse only registered with an organization that is not recognized by any other registries, could very possibly end up with an unregistered horse which cannot be shown and whose foals cannot be registered.

NAPHA-accepted registries are: AAOBPPH, PPHRNA, ANCP CPP, PHAC plus other foreign registries. Please call NAPHA if you have a question.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Everything is being done to conduct this show at the highest level and for the pleasure of exhibitors and spectators. The best adjudication officials to be found have been selected and they will place awards to the horses as they see them presented in the ring without regard for previous records or performances. The LSPHC and SWPHC are desirous of fair treatment for all exhibitors and in return asks for the cooperation of all in helping to make this show a successful and enjoyable event. Every person who participates in this show is responsible for a knowledge of and is subject to the current rules and regulations of the:

1. The NAPHA By-Laws
2. The NAPHA Book of Peruvian Horse Showing
3. The NAPHA Peruvian Horse Breed Standard, and
4. The NAPHA Code of Ethics

All showing procedures and judging percentages as well as definitions, class descriptions, descriptions of gear and attire, rules and regulations, conduct and ethics and conditions for this show are described in the above named publications.

All Exhibitors, Handlers, Riders and other persons participating in the show are responsible for a thorough knowledge of all the rules and regulations. Copies of the above named rules and regulations can be obtained from the NAPHA.

MAIDEN: For the purposes of this show, a Maiden is a horse that has never won a blue ribbon at any approved, pointed show.

JUNIOR CLASSES: Junior Classes will have two divisions for judging purposes. The two divisions will be "12 years and under" and "13 and over." Age is determined as of January 1, 2008. The two groups will be judged together but will receive awards separately.

HIGH POINT BREEDER: The NAPHA point system will be used to determine the award based on the points accumulated by the best 5 (five) placings in the qualifying classes. "Qualifying Classes" are defined as those classes that qualify a HORSE for any championship. Owner/Breeder must participate in a qualifying class with a horse owned and bred by him/her.

HIGH POINT EXHIBITOR: The NAPHA point system will be used to determine the award based on the points accumulated by the best 5 (five) placings in the qualifying classes. "Qualifying Classes" are defined as those classes that qualify a HORSE for any championship. Exhibitor must OWN the horse and participate in the show with at least 1 (one) horse.

HIGH POINT AMATEUR NOVICE RIDER: The NAPHA point system will be used to determine the award based on the points accumulated by the best 5 (five) Amateur Novice RIDERS in their qualifying classes. A Novice will be anyone who has not won 5 or more blue ribbons in the past three years. Novice competitors will sign a Novice Declaration at the beginning of the show year attesting to that fact.

HIGH POINT AMATEUR OWNER RIDER: The NAPHA point system will be used to determine the award based on the points accumulated by the best 5 (five) Amateur Owner RIDERS in their qualifying classes.

VERSATILITY AWARD - Designated classes are 12, 25, 27, 29, 35, 37, 41, 42, and 46. The horse may enter all classes for which it is qualified. However, only the five highest scores from these classes will be counted toward the award.

DRUG-FREE SHOW. There will be random testing in the Champion and Champion of Champions classes.

VETERINARIAN EXAMINATION: All animals are subject to a physical examination by the Show Veterinarian, free of charge, as a safeguard against communicable

disease. ALL HEALTH REGULATIONS WILL BE ENFORCED.

HEALTH CERTIFICATES AND PROOF OF OWNERSHIP: A Health Certificate signed by a veterinarian within 30 days of the show is required. Coggins tests less than one year old are required. Out of state horses check with your Vet! **Original Coggins test must accompany horse.**

STABLING FACILITIES: Each horse entered in this show will be required to have a stall. Fees cover BOTH shows!

Box Stalls \$65.00 each
Tack Stalls \$65.00 each
End Stalls \$100.00 each

NO STALLS WILL BE ASSIGNED WITHOUT A PROPER ENTRY FORM AND PAYMENT. Horses must be placed in assigned stalls and no change will be permitted except with the consent of the Barn Superintendent.

Each animal must be assigned a separate stall (except broodmares with suckling foals). Stalls will be ready by Thursday, April 24, 2008. Note: Arrangements for keeping horses at the show grounds before Thursday, April 24, 2008 or arriving before 9:00 AM or after 9:00 PM must be made in advance. There will be a minimum charge of \$15.00 per night per stall for early arrival or later departure from the show grounds. Please contact the Barn Superintendent to make advance arrangements. All exhibitors are advised to bring snaps, buckets, hay nets and other items necessary for the care of their horses. Bedding will be available on the show grounds at \$8.00 per bag. Every stalled horse must have one bag of shavings minimum purchased from the Brazos County Expo Complex. No outside shavings permitted under any circumstances. NO EXCEPTIONS.

ADVERTISING DEADLINE IS MARCH 20, 2008

ENTRIES: This show is open to all horses registered with NAPHA or an Approved Registry. Horses must be entered under the full registered name. No horses will be permitted to compete unless properly entered on the entry blank, which must be signed by the owner or agent and accompanied by the required entry fees, stalls or ground fees and tack room fees. **Checks shall be made payable to the LSPHC or SWPHC** and mailed with the entry to the address listed herein. The management agrees to cancel and refund entry fees on any horse not fit to show, providing a Certificate of Disability from a qualified Veterinarian is received by Show Management on Thursday, April 24, 2008, before 4:00 PM. In such event another horse from the same stable may be substituted without additional charge.

NOTE

The Arbitration Agreement on the back of the Entry Form must be signed or your entry will not be accepted.

CHAMPION AND CHAMPION OF CHAMPIONS CLASSES: Returning Champions should be pre-entered by the closing date of entries in order to appear in the program. Post entries will be allowed but must bring proof of Championship and enter by the start of the show.

A COPY OF THE REGISTRATION PAPERS MUST ACCOMPANY EACH ENTRY. *(Because we are using the NAPHA/PPHRNA computer program to run the show, NAPHA/PPHRNA registration papers are preferable.)* **ENTRIES WILL NOT BE PROCESSED WITHOUT THEM. BE SURE TO BRING PAPERS FOR POST ENTERED HORSES.** Original Coggins test must accompany horse. **Proper payment must accompany entry. If an Exhibitor desires to add classes, horses, or incurs any other expenses during the show, these must be paid for immediately or the Show Secretary given a signed, currently dated blank check.**

ENTRY DEADLINE: April 1, 2008

SUBSTITUTION OF JUDGES AND OTHER OFFICIALS: In the event that the Judge (or other official designated herein) is unable to perform his duties due to circumstances beyond his control or for any other reason, the LSPHC & SWPHC reserve the right to substitute another approved Judge (or other official) in his place.

JUDGE'S AUTHORITY: The Judge shall have the authority to place any horse in whatever position in a class he thinks the merit of the horse justifies. The Judge shall award prizes in order starting with first and may not vacate places. Five (5) horses will be placed, with reserve and any number of honorable mentions. This applies whether there are one or more entries in a class.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

RESPONSIBILITY: All entries will be accepted with the understanding that the LSPHC, SWPHC, NAPHA and the Brazos County Expo Complex will not be held responsible for any loss, personal damage or injury to horses exhibited, or for any article of any kind or nature that may be lost or destroyed or in any way damaged. All horses shall be under the control and direction of the Show Committee but solely at the risk of the Exhibitor who will be responsible for any injury that may be occasioned to any person or animal or damage to any property while on the grounds by any horse exhibited by him and shall indemnify the management against all claims or damages of any kind or nature, including attorney fees and court costs that may arise out of any injury occasioned by any horse owned and exhibited by him or arising from any cause whatever including the negligence of himself or any other person in charge of such horse.

PAYMENTS: No entry packet will be given without payment. No class changes except withdrawal will be allowed without payment or a signed blank check given to the Show Secretary.

Sunday: Classes start at 8:30 am.

FRIDAY AFTERNOON: FREE 1 hour Junior Clinic 15 minutes after conclusion of classes.

Drug Free Show: Random drug testing.

AMATEUR RIDERS: To participate in Amateur classes a rider must have an Amateur Declaration on file with the NAPHA. These forms will be available in the show office.

STALLS: No stalls will be assigned until entry form is on file with the Show Secretary including REGISTRATION PAPERS AND PAYMENT. **Horses entering at the show must write a check or leave an open check.**

GELDING PURSE CLASS: The gelding purse class will be judged as a luxury class. It will have a cash prize based on entries and will pay to five (5) places.
1st Place - 40%; 2nd Place - 30%; 3rd Place - 15%; 4th Place - 10%; 5th Place - 5%.

HIGH POINT PROFESSIONAL: Open to all professionals. YOU MUST REGISTER AT THE OFFICE (no charge) IN ORDER TO COMPETE FOR THIS AWARD. High points will be calculated from the TOP 5 placings in any UNDER SADDLE classes open to professionals. Of the 5, at least 1 must be a performance class and at least 1 must be a bozal, breeding or gait class.

SHAVINGS: The facility requires 1 mandatory bag of shavings per horse. Please try to pre-arrange how many bags you need - they will be at your stalls and will save everyone time. **YOU MAY NOT BRING YOUR OWN SHAVINGS.**

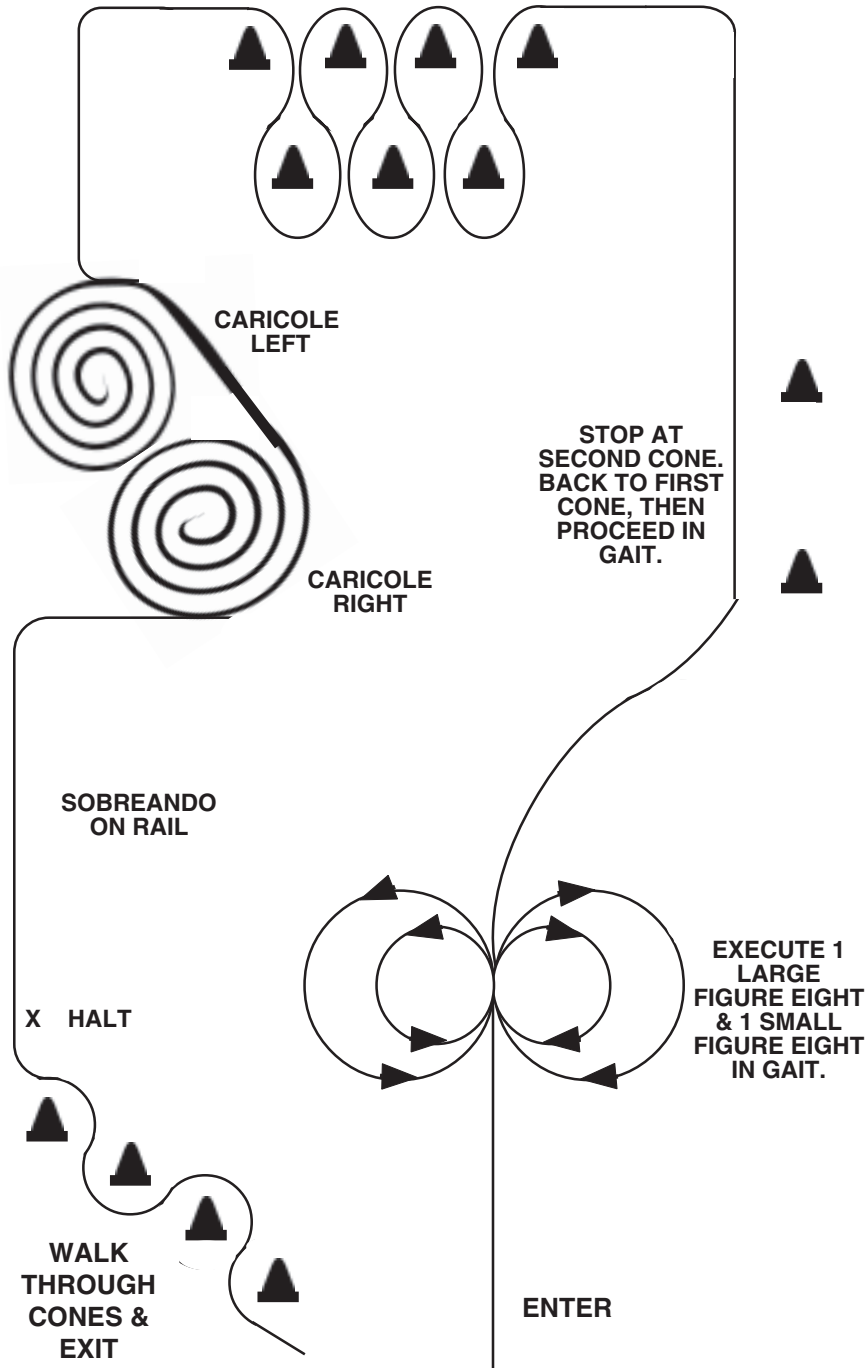

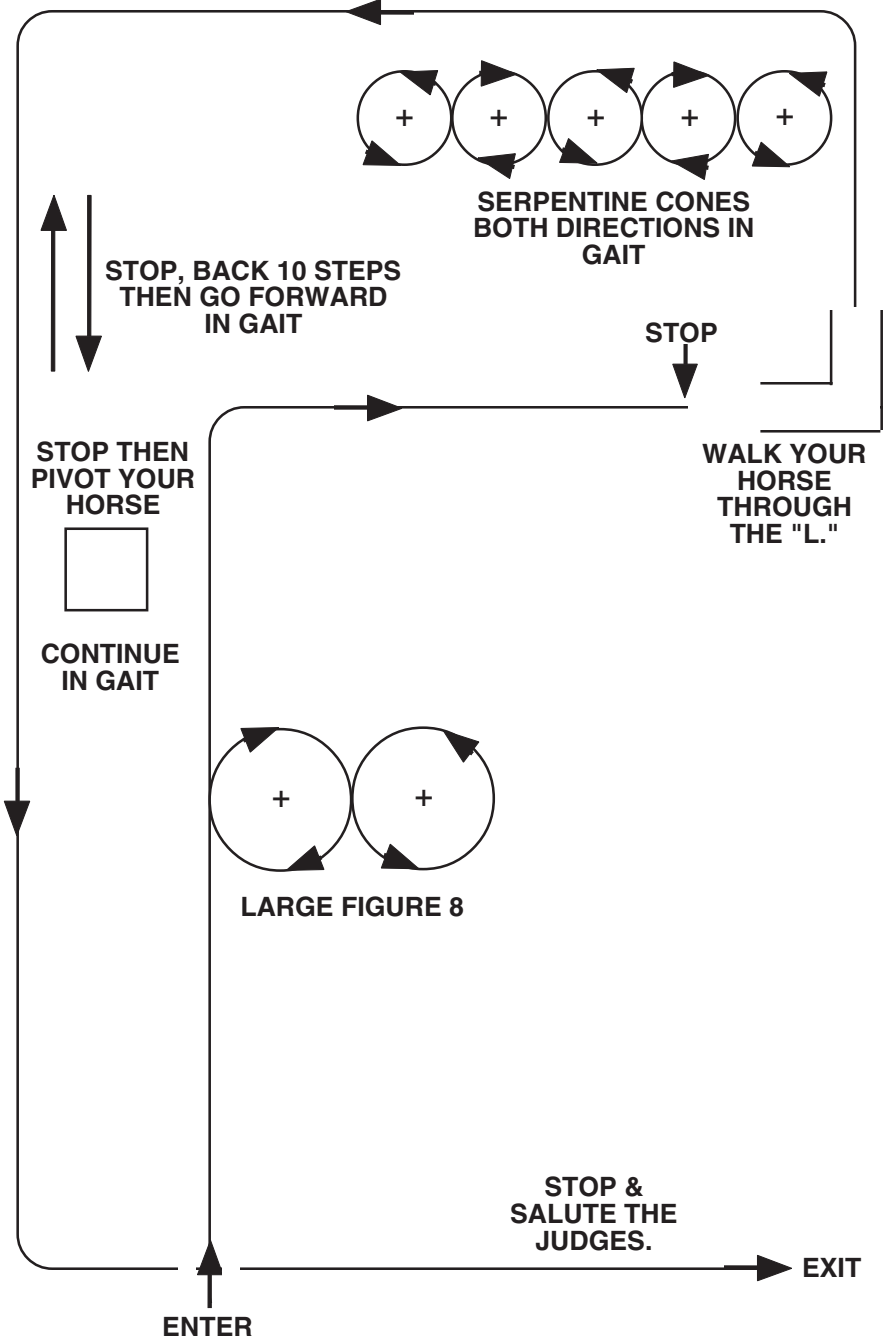

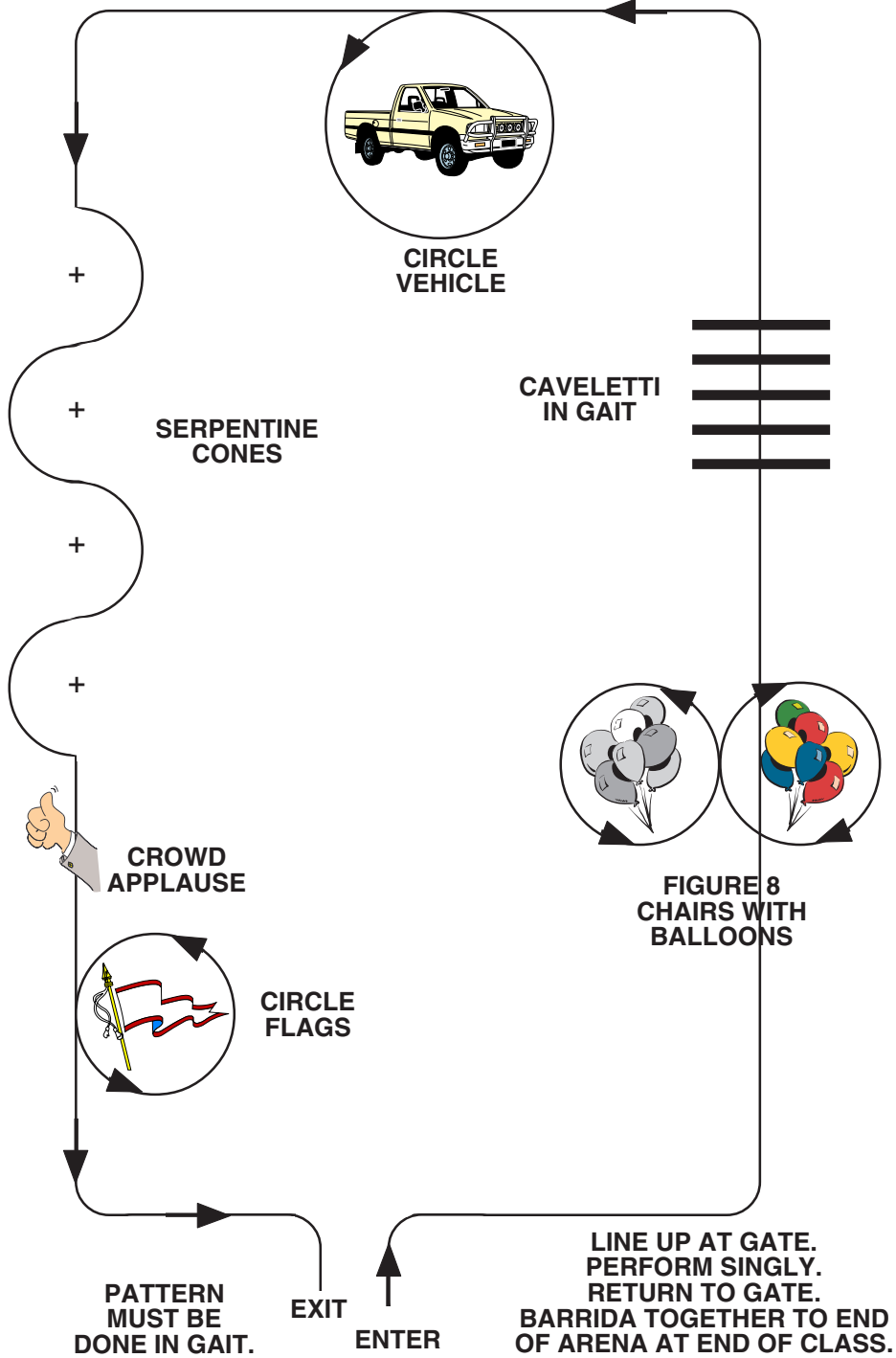
GAIT THROUGH CONES

JUNIOR HALTER SHOWMANSHIP

The junior halter showmanship class is designed to judge the exhibitor and his/her ability to present their horse to its best advantage at halter. The conformation or quality of gait of the horse is not judged in this class.

Exhibitors will execute a preposted pattern in hand (see Premium) and upon individual inspection may be asked questions by the judge on their knowledge of horsemanship. Juniors 12 years of age and younger will not be asked to gait their horses in hand. Juniors 13 years and older will be asked to gait their horses individually no more than 2 laps around the arena.

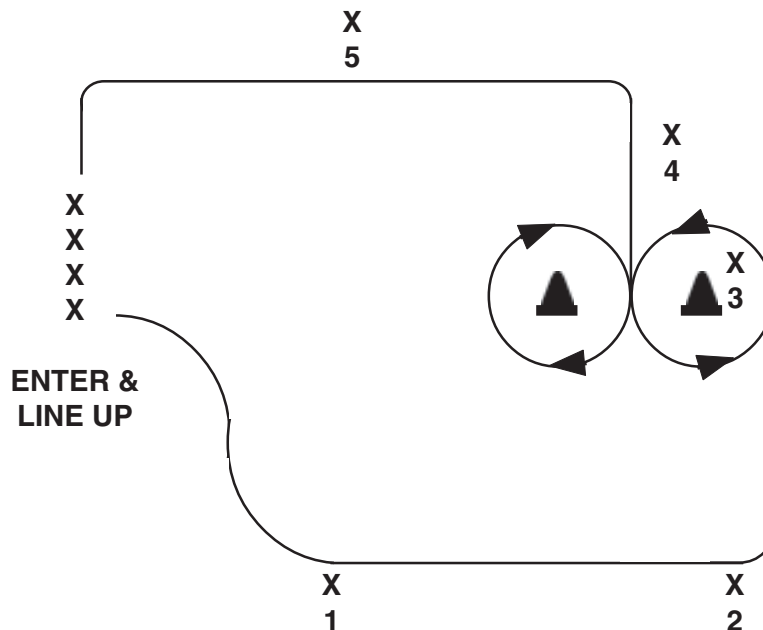
In accordance with NAPHA rules, this class is judged 70% on ability and knowledge of handler, 15% preparation and conditioning, and 15% on gait and manners.

Required attire: White shirt and pants/jeans; no hat; neutral colored belt and boots; scarf tucked into belt

Older juniors may substitute white tennis shoes for boots for the purpose of running

Presentation and performance elements of this class have been adopted from the AQHA rulebook and will be judged accordingly.

1. Individually lead horses forward to Judge for inspection.
2. Walk to rail, turn left.
3. Complete 1 figure eight around cones.
4. Stop between cones, back horse 5 steps, salute Judge.
5. Return to line-up.
